



Ordination and Installation of Elders and Deacons

Leader: There are different gifts,

People: **but it is the same spirit who gives them.**

Leader: There are different ways of serving God,

People: **but it is the same Lord who is served.**

Leader: God works through different people in different ways,

People: **but it is the same God who achieves God's purpose through them all.**

Leader: Each one is given a gift by the Spirit,

People: **to use it for the common good.**

Leader: Together we are the body of Christ,

People: **and individually members of Him.**

Leader: Though we have different gifts, together we are a ministry of reconciliation led by the risen Christ. We work and pray to make his church useful in the world, and we call men and women to faith, so that, in the end, every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of our Sovereign God.

Within our common ministry, some members are chosen for particular work as ministers of word and sacrament, elders, or deacons. In ordination, we recognize these special ministries, remembering that our Lord Jesus said:

Whoever among you want to be great must become the servant of all and if he or she wants to be first among you, he or she must be the servant of all people!
