

MEET THE SINGERS: CHOIR MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

The Marple Presbyterian Church Choir is a small but active community of diverse and talented individuals. The choir nurtures mentorship between experienced and new singers, and creates a supportive fellowship that extends beyond Sunday services. Throughout the year, we will be spotlighting some of the choir members in the weekly eBlasts.

This week, we feature **Douglas Ballard**, who was born and raised in Emmaus, PA. We are significantly blessed to have such a multifaceted musician within our midst.

1. Vocal Range (e.g. Soprano 1) and do you have any formal vocal training? *I am a Bass 2 when singing in choir, but soloing I am classified as a Lyrical Operatic Baritone*
2. What first inspired you to start singing? *My Grandmother always sang everywhere she went in the house. I liked to join in.*
3. Do you play any other musical instruments? *I am a professional F Horn and Trumpet player, and can play all brass instruments. I can also play most woodwinds at a high school level. I also dabble in drumset and pitched percussion.*
4. *How long have you been singing with the MPC choir? I joined the MPC Choir in 2008*
5. What inspired you to join this specific choir? *Susan Greene asked me to join.*
6. How would you describe your music-reading ability? *I am a band director, I would not do well at my job if I didn't read music.*
7. What songs or styles of music do you enjoy singing the most? *I enjoy Gospel and a capella tunes in choir, they often give me frision.*
8. What is your favorite choir anthem? *Susan will tell you that it's Gospel of Grace, but it's actually Witness.*
9. What does participating in a church choir mean to you as a form of ministry? *I feel that without worship music is exceptionally important to expressing your faith in God, and sharing it with the congregation is tantamount to my ministry.*
10. Tell us about an inspiring or memorable 'music' moment in your life: *I was in a very bad spot at my previous employment. I had been reassigned to a position that I was getting zero fulfilment of and was slowly falling into deep depression because of it. I had been applying for new jobs for almost 2 years, when the job I realized I really wanted called me and offered me the position. I happened to be at Marple Presbyterian Church for choir practice, and answered the phone call with the job offer to become the band director at Upper Darby High School came through. Unbeknownst to Susan, who was still running rehearsal as I answered the phone call, she began the opening bars on the organ of the Hallelujah Chorus with the gusto of the full array of pipes... right as the HR Administrator from UDSD had offered me the job. I believe the timing was God's way of saying "be sad no more." I did have to explain to that befuddled HR administrator that that was not a planned event, and was totally spontaneous... but I do believe God's Angels were singing for me at that moment.*
11. What is your favorite color? **Blue**
12. What is your go-to comfort food? **Spaghetti and Meat Sauce**
13. Favorite down-time activity or hobby. *I enjoy playing video games. I am currently working my way through Baldur's Gate 3. For fitness I enjoy swimming laps at the Springfield YMCA.*
