HYMN HISTORY SERIES

When Morning Gilds the Skies

Did you know?...Originating in Wurzburg, on the Main River near Frankfurt, this hymn was written by an unknown German author, and first appeared in a Roman Catholic hymnal in 1828. Some sources say the hymn was written in 1818; others list an even earlier date. The original hymn had 14 stanzas. It was translated from German into English in 1854 by Edward Caswell (1814-1878), a Roman Catholic priest from England, who translated it into 28 couplets (or 2-line stanzas with a repeated refrain). Edward Caswell was the son of an Anglican clergyman, and converted to Catholicism in 1847 prior to translating the hymn. The original tune used was "Beim frühen Morgenlicht," but the tune "Laudes Domini" was written by Joseph Barnby (1838-1896) specifically for this text. The tune and text were first published together in 1868, and is the tune we use to this day. Joseph Barby was an outstanding English organist and choirmaster who was knighted by Queen Victoria in 1892 in honor of his musical contributions.
